It does not appear in H.F. Walling's 1861-62 map. It likely was built c1870, possibley late 1860s. This location had a shoes or clothing store from many decades, at least the early 1880s to the late 1950s. First was **D.W. Downey** had a boot & shoe store here from at least 1883 or earlier. He moved from this address c1888 to the newly built "Downey" block on the south side, where he would stay for several decades until the end. D.W. Downey lived at 118 James St

Joseph A. and Louis M. They both resided at <u>22 Broad St</u>.

1890/1896: Moses Silver, clothing (116), E. York barbershop (114u)

1883/1886: D.W. Downey, boot & shoe dealer (116)

1899/1926: Globe Clothing House (116)

Globe was run by S.L. Vineberg, who resided at <u>74 Garden St</u>. He was possibly a son of C.P. Vineberg, who ran a similar store in the 1800s just on the other side of Buell St, called London Cash Clothing. After a quarter of a century, Globe's was replaced by Wiseman Brothers, clothing, who were there until the late 1950s. Wiseman's was started and owned throughout by brothers

(1880s address system). Moses Silver replaced him with a clothing shop. He would move out of here around 1898, to the other






