This spot had been vacant with no building throughout time until around 1917. It is not a very wide spot. By the teens there were very few spots left on crowded King St. so it was finally developed.

One of Brockville's longest continuous businesses is the 1000 Islands Reastaurant & Pizzaria. Their sign states "Since 1970". They do appear in the 1969 Vernon's directory as being here. Probably they had acquired the spot in '69 and did not actually open until shortly into the new year.
